

In-Box Review of Trumpeter 1:24 Messerschmitt Bf109 G-2 by Will Kuhrt

263 parts. Two decal versions. 8./JG 52 Black 13 *Oberst Gunther Rall* and 9./JG 52 Yellow 1 *Hermann Graf*

The box is huge. If you are a lover of box art, you'll really like the beautifully rendered Bf109 G-2 *Black 13* in flight. A few years ago, I began saving box art and using it to decorate my man cave. I'm excited to see this one on the wall . . . eventually! The box is nicely packed and contains eleven sprues. Clear canopy and small parts, rubber tires, screws and photoetched parts are packaged in a convenient accessories box.


If you've never built a trumpeter kit before, you'll be surprised to see a clear plastic sprue of the left and right fuselage halves accompanied by their respective control surfaces. Trumpeter does this to provide the model builder with a way to display the engine, cockpit and other internal workings. I am admittedly not a fan of using shortcuts like this and would prefer to work out a more realistic way to display the internal mechanisms. There are also two canopy sprues provided. I'm not sure why this is, because they are identical, but my guess is that they provided it as a backup in case one is marred during painting. Let's face it. . . any mistakes at this scale will stick out like a sore thumb.

The parts are nicely detailed, and most are free of sink marks and flash, although I spotted some that will need a little cleanup. The engine is impressive, as is the cockpit, but the cockpit lacks all hints of wiring and does have a few technical flaws. Another downside with the cockpit is that the instrument panel is a decal. There are many third-party upgrades available for those of you who are into super detailing, and I would be inclined to get a cockpit upgrade (or scratch build) to provide a more realistic instrument panel. The fuselage and control surfaces are clean and have excellent panel line and rivet detail. I did not see any warped parts.

The 16-page assembly guide is very clear and easy to follow. Assembly begins with the engine, continues with the cockpit, landing gear, fuselage, control surfaces, and wings. I believe that some of their painting suggestions are not quite accurate and suggest you rely on external references for painting.

The painting instruction for both versions is provided on a brightly colored guide. Paint corresponds to ModelMaster (enamel and acryl) and Polly scale paints. You'll have to consult paint conversion charts if you intend to use other brands. The water-slide decals by AeroMaster are superb with accurate color register and appropriately thin. Many third-party decals are available if you want to model an aircraft other than one of the two provided in this kit.

I was excited to find this kit for sale at a recent contest, and the price was great! Now we'll see how the building goes.
