

# 2019 Old Dominion Open: Richmond, VA by Mike Turco • photos by the author

f you thought last year's 800+ models couldn't be beaten, you needed to see this year's event, held on February 23. The IPMS Richmond club outdid themselves again, as their 2019 Old Dominion Open Model Show and contest was the largest in its history. Despite the cold and rainy weather that lasted all day, 213 entrants displayed 988 models, and over 700 general admission visitors attended. Add to that 60 vendors spread over 177 eight-foot tables both in the main display room and the adjacent room, the latter needed to accommodate the vendor overflow. I can't imagine there is a bigger local IPMS event in the USA.

**Among the contest's 75 categories** were a few new ones, including Sci-Fi and Spacecraft split into flying and on-the-ground models, two Gundam categories that totaled a whopping 90 entries if I remember correctly, and a category for "Automotive Rust, Dust and Junkyard" models. I have argued for years that the latter subject

is one that deserved its own category, separate from the stock car and show car categories, since it demands a unique skill set and should not be directly competing with the efforts of those modelers trying for finish perfection. I was so glad that the Richmond club established it that I sponsored its awards. Way to go, Richmond!

**Bob Cicconi and I attended** this year and came away with a few awards, listed in the table on page 3.

## The Richmond

**club** is a credit to the IPMS and Region 2. I urge those who haven't been to an "ODO" to plan to attend next year. Will they break the 1,000-entry barrier? Don't bet against it!

## THEME CONTESTS **2019**

## January "The Vietnam War Era"

Model of a subject from the period of the overt U.S. action during the war, i.e., August 1964 – April 1975.

## February "It's Cold in Here"

Any build with a winter theme.

## **March "The Sixties**

Model in any category (auto, aircraft, armor, ship, etc.) of a subject born in the years 1960 - 69.

## April "Classic Plastic"

Model kit in any category (auto, aircraft, armor, ship, etc.) that was issued before 1980.

## May "D-Day"

In honor of the 75th anniversary of the event, model must somehow be related to the D-Day invasion of June 6, 1944.

## June

No theme. Gold/Silver/Bronze judging.

## July "50 Shades of Grey"

Model of any subject in any category that is/was mostly grey, either in overall color or camouflage.

## August "The Axis"

Model of a subject in any category from, and/or employed by, the Axis nations in WWII.

## September "That's a New Kit!"

A build of anything from a kit that was released no earlier than 2014.

## October "Big Builds"

Any kit in the large end of its category's scale spectrum.

## November "No Big Six"

Model in any category (auto, aircraft, armor, etc.) but one that cannot be of US, British, German, Japanese, Russian or French origin.
