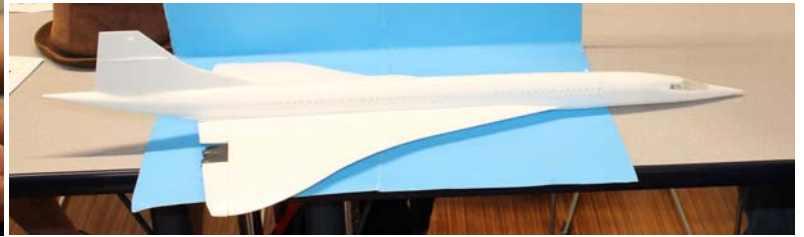

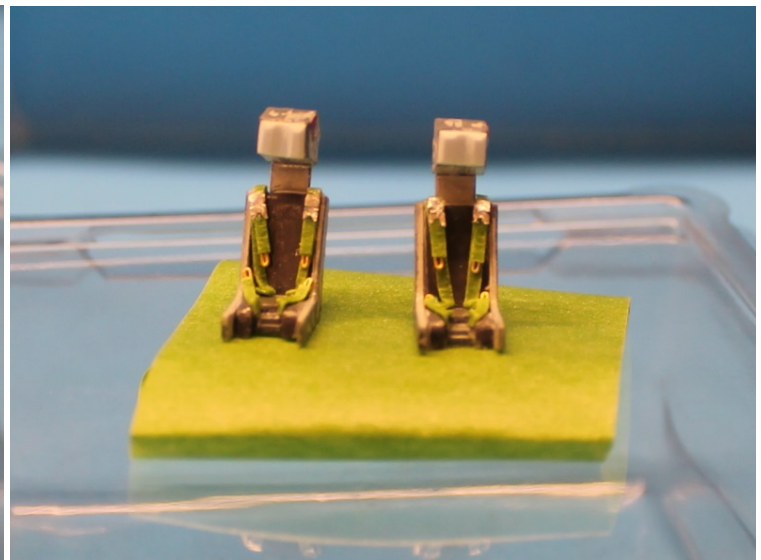
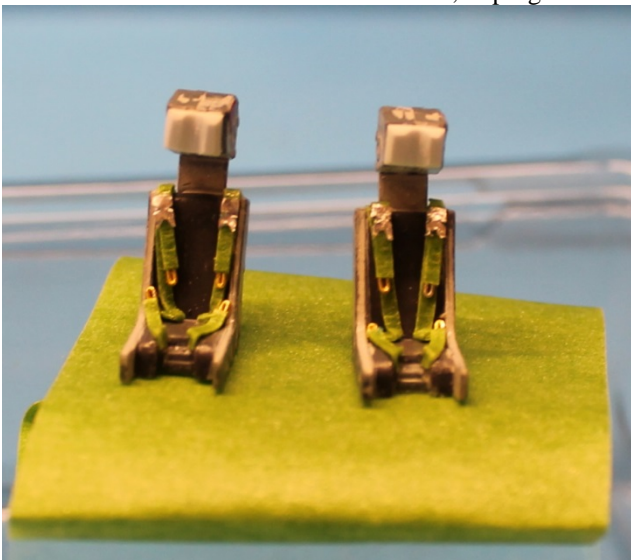

Edward Melle used tape belts, brass wire, and aluminum foil to detail the seats for his 1/72<sup>nd</sup> Eduard L-39C

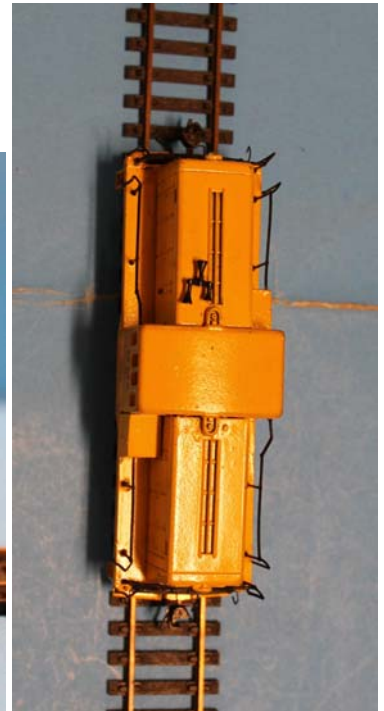


Rich Filteau marked his 1/48<sup>th</sup> Tamiya F4D Skyray with markings from VF-162 "The Hunters" circa 1963





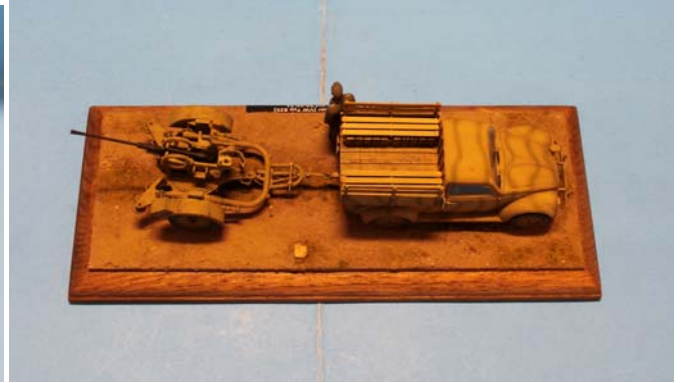
