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Meeting Notes

The purpose of this newsletter is to clarify some immediate plans and goals for the club. Anyone who has models that have not been judged in a monthly contest is urged to bring them in for the August meeting. Please remember that all models entered for judging (or just on display) should be accompanied by a card giving the pertinent information (kit manufacturer, scale, decals, modifications, etc) and the builder's name on the back side. Winners from the June contest were: lst, Steve Lewis (Mack Truck); 2nd, Scott Taylor (Railroad Gun); 3rd, Don MacBean (S-3). Congratulations.

For the non-contest months we plan to schedule a series of modelling workshops, such as the vacu-form kit building discussion held last April. Possible topics may include figure painting, airbrushing, decal application, rigging, cockpit detailing, or any other problem area where we can all benefit from an open discussion of tips and pitfalls. For these meetings members are encouraged to bring models, success or failure, recently built or dust-encrusted, that relate to the topic at hand.

Furthermore, we encourage members to bring models to build at meetings. Any meeting! We can't think of a better way to prompt the exchange of information than by example. After the business meeting plan on spending a relaxing hour or two building a model. Remember how much fun it was? Throw a few tools in a box, bring your sandpaper and spit and let's go!

(No, we won't snow slides of all of them.) best in Show was won by a super-detailed 1/72 hawsegawa F-15. Every panel that could be opened was opened, including the whole engine bay.

The banquet speaker was Mr. John Dunn of Rockwell International who gave an interesting talk and slide presentation about Space Shuttle and its mission. Tours were given to 84th Division Army Reserve, Brook Steven's Automobile Museum and the Experimental Aircraft Association Museum. The EAA museum, along with a wealth of home-puilts, contains many restored military aircraft like: Pfalz D-II, Fokker Dr-I, P-39, Ju-87, Ki-84, F-80 and F-86.

No national convention is complete without the Boyal Canadian Beer Blast, which was a lot of fun and very well lubricated (Milwaukee, remember?). It lasted longer than any of the Seattle contingent, including our latest and furthest-out member (in any sense of the word), Ross Sharp, of Derby England. (It takes some sense of the explaining.)

Several interesting items came up at the business meeting. Combat Fublishing will soon print a book of modeling hints and tips compiled from IFMS national and chapter publications. koyalties will go into the IPMS treasury. It is expected to be out this fall. The survey run in Update a few months ago revealed that the average national member is 35, spends about \$150 per year on references, kits and supplies (in that order), prefers wwII, post wwII and between the wars subjects (in that order) and has about 300 unpuilt kits. (The extreme reported was 3000.) One surprise was that the most popular areas are (in order) 1/48 aircraft, 1/72 aircraft, and 1/35 armor.

Next year's convention will be in Salt Lake City, July 24 - 27 with tours to Hill AFB and guest speaker Robin Olds. Plan on it!
