This new kit from Airfix should gladden the hearts of all 1/48th fans as it represents by far the best Hurricane available in this scale.

The 55 parts are, in the main, dimensionally correct, although the extreme rear fuselage does suffer from an over enthusiastic taper in the vertical plane around the control cable inspection panel area. One eminent reviewer has stated that the kit has no dihedral. This is incorrect. The dihedral is there, about 10 to 1½0 but could be made more prominent. Regretably Airfix has perpetuated the undercarriage errors found in their recent 1/72nd kit. The angle that the main gear brace makes with the coleo strut should be far more acute. Unfortunately this means the wheelwells and gear covers are in trouble too. (Revell and Heller are the only manufacturers to get the undercarriage right.)

The cockpit area is very good with molded side detail and a nice instrument panel. General surface detail is excellent with sensitively portrayed fabric effect on the control surfaces and rear fuselage, and exceptionally fine Dzuz fasteners on the cowl panels. Early "kidney shaped" ejector exhausts are supplied and alternative propellors, Rotol and DeHavilland; are provided. The blades are separate and are located by the "peg and disc" method, a rather messy treatment I feel. The differences in blade profile and spinner shape are neatly brought out, but couldn't we have had a lovely two-bladed Watts instead?

Fine touches abound, such as the bifurcated carburetor in-

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Fine touches abound, such as the bifurcated carburetor intake, the thin landing light covers, and the correctly shaped seat. But small irritations are present too, with the integrally molded rear-view mirror (which is going to be hard to clean up) and the separate gun covers (pieces 49 & 50, why?).

The decal sheet is quite good, giving a choice of Battle of France 85 Sqdn machine (DH prop) based at Lille/Sedin April 1940 or a Battle of Britian 501 Sqdn Mk I (Rotol prop) at RAF Kenley Oct. 1940. A full set of stencil markings are supplied. The sheet in my kit was in good register and reasonably matte.

On the whole this is a very welcome kit and one which lends itself to quite a number of conversion possibilities, providing you don't mind a little correction work first.


## Tips

EPOXY FILLER

Using Sears "Filled Epoxy Cement" (#80605) for model work has several advantages over the usual autobody putties like Green Magic and its relatives. The epoxy is a two part mix and cures, (8 hrs at room temp) rather than dries. This means it doesn't shrink and crack. It is stronger and tougher than body putties and sands more like plastic, making it easier to smooth and blend contours. The epoxy contains no solvents so it is ideal for working on vacuform model's thin plastic without causing warpage, and filling around canopies without fogging the clear plastic. While it shows less tendency to flake off, like most fillers it bonds best when the surface is oil free and slightly rough. Before it cures, the epoxy is water soluable making it easy to wipe off tools and to remove unintended applications.

### Russia's Lone Wolf

The colors are RAF Dark Green and Dark Earth upper surfaces and Sky underside and spinner. The wolf, the number 60 and the slogans over the fuselage star are white. The serial, BM 959 is black. The gun port panel is red. The stars on the fuselage are red with white outline and those underwing are red only.
