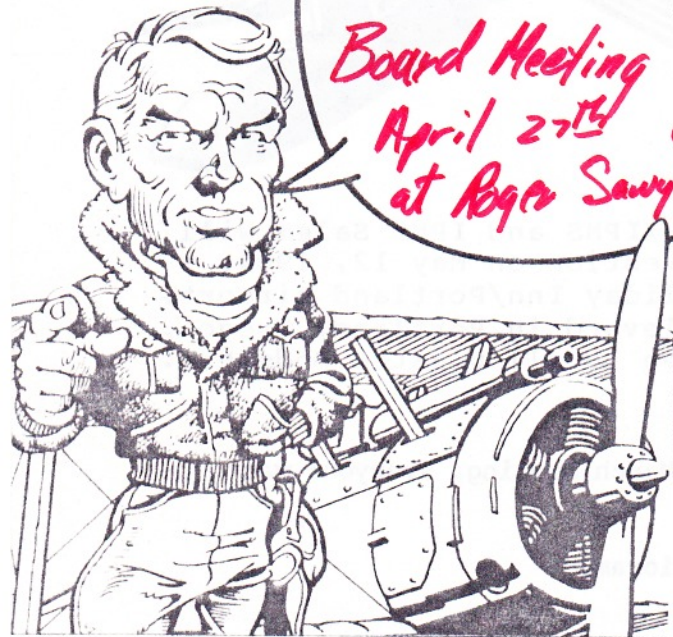

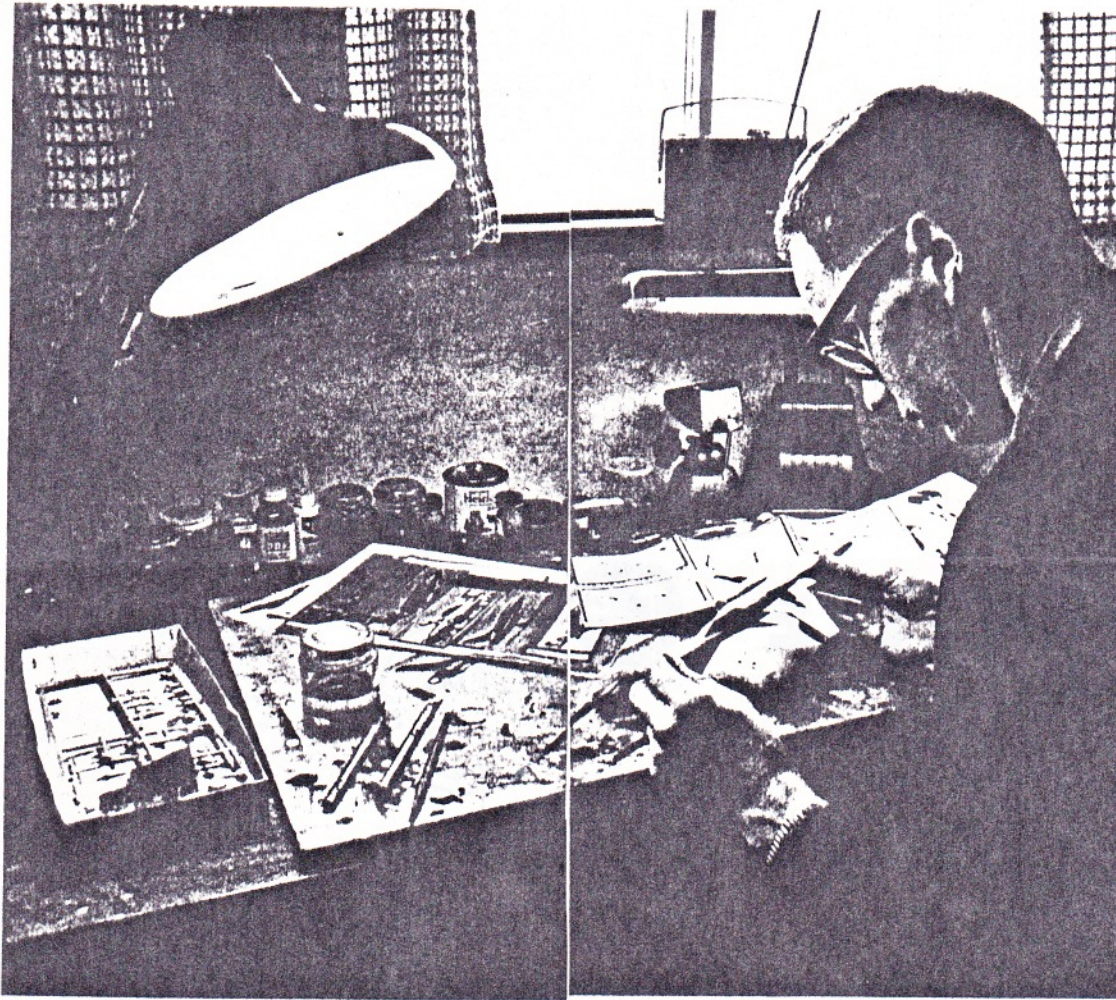

Due to the the quality of all the models at the March meeting, everyone was awarded a first place ribbon. The Winners were:

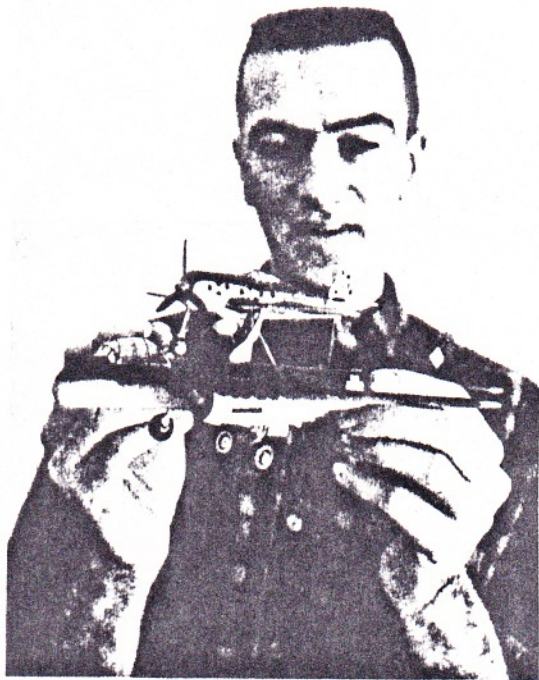

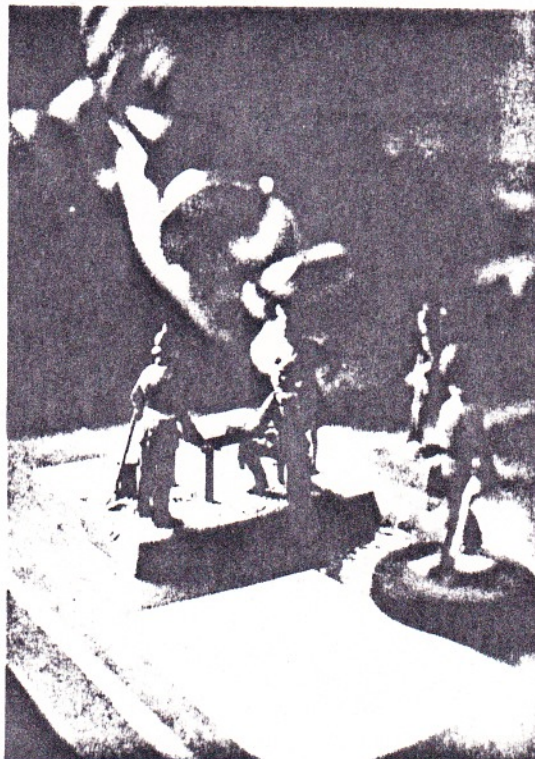


Norman Filer assembled a model jet fighter from a kit imported from Japan. Directions are in Japanese, but standard construction techniques are used on all the model-plane kits.

Code-named Mistal during World War II, the combination was used for long-range reconnaissance with the Junkers also being used as a flying bomb, the Focke Wulf releasing it and flying back to base for another mission.
