Together we, with the embryo IPMS Chinook Winds (also of Calgary) and IPMS Edmonton are presently considering initiating Western Canada's first model convention. Should we receive favourable response to this idea we would work towards holding it in either Calgary or Edmonton in May or early June 1985.

IPMS Calgary previously held a mini convention/contest in June 1983 which, despite the late arranging, turned out to be an event that was enjoyed by all who attended.

This event consisted of a contest, film and video presentations, a banquet and awards ceremony and auction. Categories ranged from Aircraft to Miscellaneous with each category being split into two age groups. Additionally there were separate categories for Dioramas and Figures (Metal and Plastic). Awards were also given for the Best in Show and Best Tamiya entry. With support that was received from Manufacturers, Distributors and local hobby stores, a total of approaching \$1250 was given away in prizes and trophies.

If we can generate sufficient interest in this venture we feel sure that it will be a worthwhile event with hopefully, a visit to the British Army Battlegroup at CFB Suffield and other places of interest laid on.

We are approaching some 15 American and 6 Canadian IPMS Chapters to gauge their and your, interest in the proposed project. As yet, we are in the initial planning stages and would be most appreciative of any comments or suggestions you or your members may have in relation to this proposal and if they would be interested in attending.
