Also, Harry Avis will present his long awaited discussion on the use of model railroad parts. You will be amazed at what the railroad guys are doing with small fiddly bits these days.

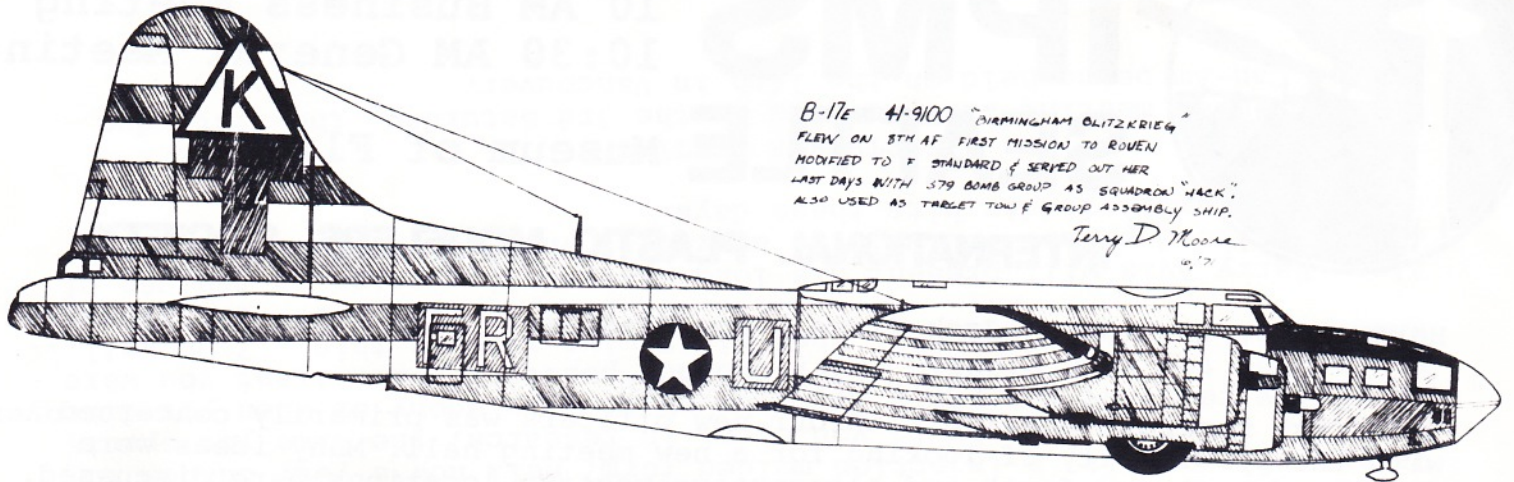
### SEPTEMBER MEETING
